**Working across the UK, the Holocaust Educational Trust educates about the Holocaust and its contemporary relevance.** We partner with schools, colleges and universities to provide teacher training, classroom resources, the [Lessons from Auschwitz Project](#) for post-16 students and teachers, and the opportunity to hear the personal testimony of a survivor through our [Outreach programme](#).

More than **1200** teachers take part in our programmes each year. We offer professional training workshops and Continuing Professional Development courses free of charge to new and experienced teachers across the UK. Our sessions are delivered by an experienced team of practitioners and focus on pedagogical issues and practical ideas for your classroom.

# Bespoke Training Workshops

The Trust works with Initial Teacher Training providers, through universities, school-centred schemes and employment-based programmes, as well as providing Continuing Professional Development and in-service training to experienced school staff.



Our free 90-minute online workshops, and in-person full-day or half-day pedagogical workshops, are delivered to primary and secondary teachers and trainees across the UK and are adaptable to meet the needs of your school or institution.

Sessions can be targeted for a particular subject area or delivered to cross-curricular groups.

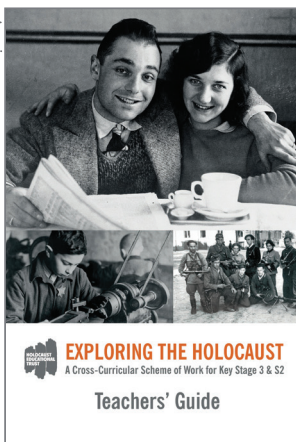
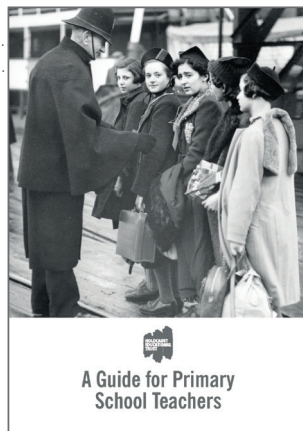

# Resources for Teachers

Our educational programmes are supported by a range of free guidance materials, lesson plans and resources for use in both primary and secondary classrooms. Teachers can access these resources at [www.het.org.uk](http://www.het.org.uk).

The Holocaust Educational Trust's **A Guide for Primary School Teachers** has been created to support the growing number of primary school teachers who wish to explore issues related to the Holocaust with their students. The guide and accompanying scheme of work are aimed at students in Year 6 in England and Wales, Year 7 in Northern Ireland and P6 and P7 in Scotland.



**Exploring the Holocaust** is our flagship resource which offers a free, comprehensive and flexible cross-curricular scheme of work for the teaching of the Holocaust at Key Stage 3 in England, Wales and Northern Ireland and at S2 in Scotland. It contains 15 downloadable lesson plans with accompanying resources for use in History, Religious Education or Philosophy, and Citizenship or PSHE, together with guidance documents for English, Art and Drama.
